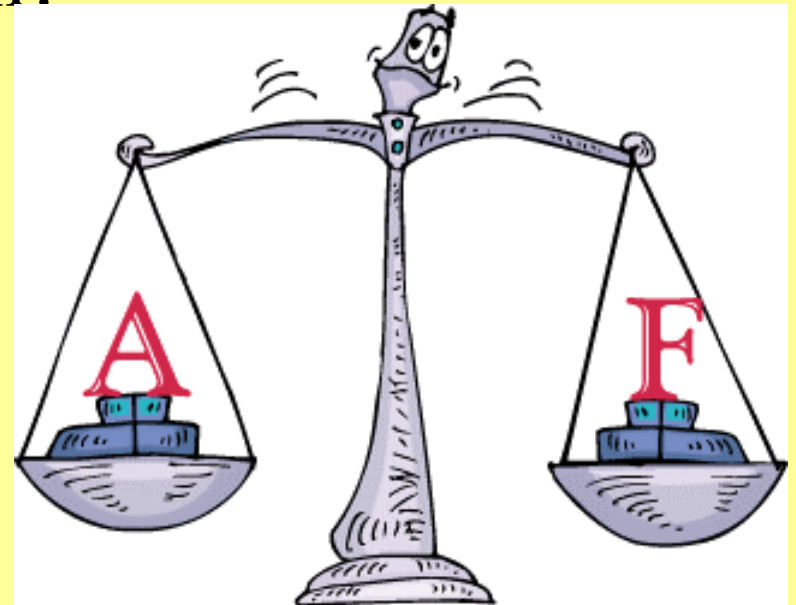

What's a Rubric Anyway?

A rubric is a scoring guide that evaluates student performance based on a full range of real world criteria rather than a single numerical score.



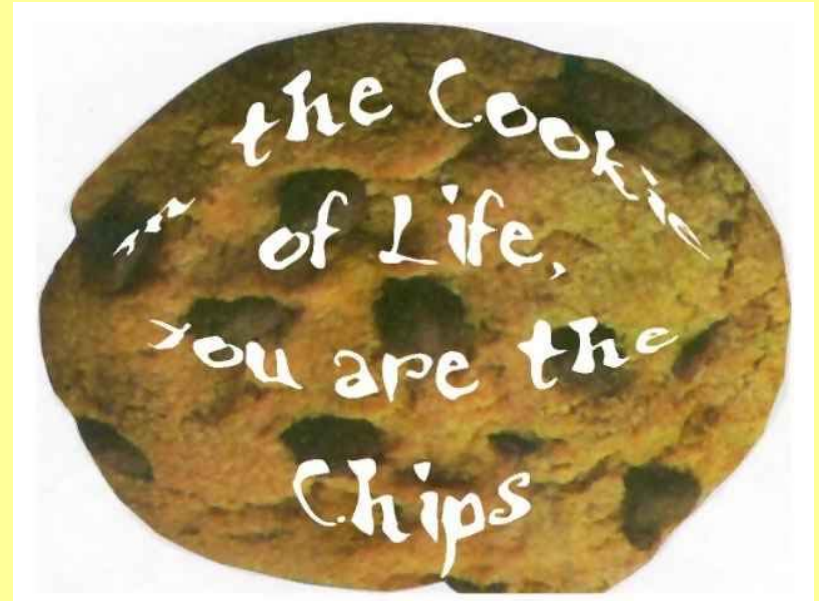


Rubric Recipe

- What are the *ingredients* of an assignment?
(“what counts,” criteria for excellence, how will students be judged successful or not)
- What are the levels of quality?
